In the nam of God Amen the firste daye of Apryelle in the yere of owere Lord M CCCC LXVIII [1564] I **Symunt Huntingtun** of Battisford in the countie of Suffoke being of holle mynde and parfite memorie thanks be to Almighty god make my testament and laste wille in this maner folowyng fyrste I bequeath my sowell unto Almighty god viz to deliver the Chrystes kingdom of heven my bodie to be buried where it shall all please Almighty god. Itm I wyll & bequeath to **An my Wiffe** my beste bede with all that there to belongith & one othere bed wythe all that there to belongith. Itm I geve & bequeath to **An my wife** my tenement that I holde of **James Hubbard esquyere** callyd **Brayes** with all the landis there to belongyng duwerynge hure [her] mortaweyll [mortel] lyffe & when it shawell [shall] plesse god to caulle the fore said **An my wyffe** unto of this worlde then I wyll that it shawyll remayne to **Barnard my sune** to himme or to his heyerris. Item I geve and bequeath to **An my wyffe** my ten[em]ent of **Burnes** with all the landis thereto belongyng wyche I hould of **my ladie gressume [Gresham]** be [by] coppie of coyte rohell [copy of court roll] deweryng [during] the tyme of hire mortawell life and when it shall plesse god to cawell her unto of this life then I wille that **Edmund my sone** shawell have that tenement caullid of **Burnyes** with all the lands that I houild [hold] of **my ladie Gressum [Gresham]** to him and to his Hyeres. Item I wille and bequeathe to **Gilbarde my sone** five akarris [acres] of meddue [meadow] in **Battysford Fen** that I houelde [hold] of **Jamys Hubbard esquyere** bi [by] coppie of corte rohell where of an akyere [acre] lythe [lies] beyond the **Ryvare [river]** to him and to his hyeris. Item I wille that **Gilbarde my sone** shawill have any and awill [all] rents to hym & to his hyeris of tenne shyllinges & fowere pence bi yere that I bowte of **Sir John Polly [Poley] of Badlie [Badley]** the wyche rent is payd unto of the tenement **Burbyllis in comys [Combs]** by **Edmund Palmare [Palmer]**. Item I wille that **Henrie my sonne** shall have my landis in **Comeys [Combs]** to hyme or to his heiris called **mottys or mottswood** which I latelie bowte of **John Skote**

of **poswyke [Postwick]** in the countye of **Norfoke {???** & payere of endentirs [indentures?] doth apere. Item I wyll that **Henrie my sone** or his hyere shall paye to **Gilbarde my son** or his hyers £3 6s and 8d to be paid in 2 yere after his entrie of the lands afore said that is to saye the firste yere 33s 4d and the nexte yere 33s 4d in full payment of three pounds six shillings and eight pence. Item I will that **Henrie my son** or his heir shall pay to **Edmund my son** or his heir £3 6s 8d of good & lawfull money of England in 2 years that is to say the third year after his entrie his XXXiii shillings iiiii pence and the nexte yere ensewyinge [ensuing] XXXiii shillings iiiii Pence in full payment of £3 Vi Shillings and viii pence. Allso I will that **Henrie my son** or his eyers shawyll paye to **Barnard my son** or his heirs £3 6s and 8d of good & lawfull money of England to be payd in 2 yeaes that is to saye in the fyrste yere aftere his enterie 33s 4d and the nexte yere {after} followyng 33s 4d in full payment of £3 6s 8d. Item I will and do give to **Robrte my son** the **farme** that we lease hould of **James Hubbard esquyere & Fransis his wife** with & wyll [while] the korne [corn] and gresse growing upon the sayd farme and korne to sede the land all that is apoyntyd to be souen [sown] ate [at] his entrie. Allso I wyll that **Robrt my sun** shawyll have korne sufficiently to fynde [fund] his house for one holle yere aftere my deses [decease]. Also I wyll that **Robrte my sun** shall have fowere of my beste horses or marries [mares] wyche he wyll take. Also I wyll that **Robart my sun** shawll have syxe of my mylche kene [dairy cows]. Also the

reste of my katyll [*cattle*] I wylle shaull be equaelly devydid to **my wife** and fowere of my children that is to saye to **Gylbard my sun & Henrye my sun, Edmund my sun and Barnard my sun** to evary one of them alike parte. Itm I wyll that awyll the reste of my movabyllis ^{^goodis^} note [*not*] gyvnye nor be guevyd shauall be equally devided to **An my wife and Roberte my sun Gilbard my sun Henrye my sun Edmund my sun and Barnard my sun** to evarye one of them alike parte.

I ordyn [*ordain*] and make to be myne execketerres [*executors*] to see that my wylle performyd and to take my dettys and to paye my dettys



First and before all transitory things I bequeath my Soule unto Almighty God my maker and unto Jesus Christ my redemer and saviour hopinge by his death & passion to inheryt ever lasting lyef. And my body to the churth frome where it was taken and Christianly to be buried when and where it shall please God to call me. Itm I gyve and bequeath unto **Margaret my Weff** [Wife] all that my house & land set lyinge & beinge in Battsforde aforesaid with all & singular the comodityes & {profits?} thereupon growinge & increasing ^{???} {fr??} or {???}^ during the mynoritye & {vantage?} of **Robert Huntington my Sonne** towards the payment of my debts & bringing uppe of my children with all my stocke expense of houshold & households enough to her & to the heyres of our two bodyes holdinge and paying unto **my two daughters Ellyne & Maryon** ten pounds a peace [*piece*] of lawfull mony and at such tyme & tymes as hereinafter is specified Viz. Item I gyve and bequeath unto **Ellyne my daughter** tenne pounds of mony to be payed unto her within fower yeares next after my decease. Item I gyve & bequeath unto **Marryon my daughter** tenne pounds of good mony to be payed her within five yeares next after my departure. Item I gyve & bequeathe unto **Robert Huntington** my sonne my sayde house & land with the appurtenances to him and to his heyres for ever vetoing & paying unto his **three systers that is to saye Ales** [*Alice*] **Margaret and Elizabeth** twenty marks* a pece of good mony and at such tymes as hereafter is mentioned that is to saye Item I give and bequeath unto **Ales** my daughter syx pounds thirteen shillings and fower pence of lawfull monye and to be gyvene her payment when two yeares next after the entrye of his lande and his Age of 21 yeares after of her legacye of 6L 13s and 4d. Item I give & bequeath unto **Margaret my daughter** 6L 13s and 4d of good money to be payed within three yeares next after the entrye of his lande and his age of one and twenty yeares in payment of her legacye of 6L 13s and 4d. Item I gyve and bequeath unto **Elizabeth my daughter** lyke sume of 6L 13s 4d of good money and to be payed to her next in fower yeares next after his attaynemente unto his land. Item I gyve and bequeath unto **Symonde Huntington my sonne** three score pounds to be payd his {???} by his **Brother Robert Huntington my sone** in such tyme & years as hereinafter is nominated. Viz. that is to saye

twenty pounds within five yeares next after that **Robert** shall enter his lande and accomplish his full age of 21 yeares in payment of his legasye of three score pounds of good mony. And so in likewise beginning with **Ales my daughter** {??} tyme the sixt yeare to paye her other 6L 13s 4d of lawfull [*money*] in full satisfaction of her legasye of twenty marks. In {???} the seventh yere to paye other 6L 13s 4d to **Margaret my daughter** in full satisfaction then of 6L 13s 4d payd her full sume. Also I gyve unto **Elizabeth my daughter** the eighth yeare next after his entrance into his land after 6L 13s 4d in full satisfaction of her legacy. Item I give and bequeath unto **Symond** other twenty pounds of good & lawfull monye to be payed unto him the ninth yeare after **Robert** shall accomplishe his full Age of 21 yeares. Also I will and my mynde is that within two yeares after the last payment unto **Symonde** then be payd by **Robert unto Symonde** other 21 [*20?*] pounds in full satisfaction of three score pounds of good monye. Moreover I will & my mynde is that if **Roberte Huntington my sone** shall refuse to performe this my last will in {???} as is mensioned in this my will & testament then I will that **Symonde Huntington** shall undertake the lyfe payment that **Robert** should have done and also enter into all my lande & at the same yeares as **Robert** should if had not refused. Also further I will that yf it shall please God to call **Robert** unto his mercy before he attayne unto his full age of 21 yeares without issue of his body lawfully begotten, then my mynd is that **Symond** my sonne shall enter upon the land not his payment as **my sonne Roberte** shall if he had lyved and at such yeares and tymes. Also if yt shall please God to take **Symonde** unto his mercy before he shall attayne unto 21 yeares without issue of his bodye lawfully begotten then I will that my lands be sould by my Executors and the said mony to be equally [divided] amonge all my children then surviving distributed & performed indyferently between them both my elder and younger children. Also further yt is my mynde that the children of John Kempster that is to saye John Bedyett &

Robert Kempster be educated & brought up by my Executors untyll the tyme limited in their fathers Will as I am bound by sertin of my executors {???) in the same will of the foresaid John Kempster. The rest of all my good & chattels not gyven nor bequeathed I gyve that unto **Margaret my wiff [wife]** whome I ordayne and appoint my Executrix to take my debts & paye my debts & to se[e] my/any some {???) charge defreyed & my body {a??erently} buried. Revokinge all other willes & executors unto nothing will I have unto my hand & seole in the presence of

For as much as Sinne hath made man mortall soe as the soule hath not in perpetuall dwelling in the bodie but is to depart out of it at the time appointed in the Lord of life which although it be sett downe in God and sure most just yet it is unatayne and secrett to all mankind and therefore most necessarie that everi one one be prepared and readie to depart and come when God shall call therefore I Robert Huntington of Hitchim in the Countie of Suffolk and diocese of Norwich Yeoman being this seventh of November one thousand six hundred thirtie three and in the ninth year of the reigne of our Sovereigne Lord Charles by the Grace of God King of England Scotland France and Ireland defender of the faith etc of good and perfect remembrance thanks bee given unto God for it doe the rather by his grace intend to prepare and make my self readie for the poan [*pain?*] of all the world and to that end revoking all other Wills & Testamente heretofore by me made I doe ordeyne constitute, make and declare this to be my last will and testament in manner and forme following, First and principally I bequeath my soule until God my mercifull father redeemer and sanctifier in Christ and the most precious favors that he of his rich grace hath given me to use and order according to rule of his law most humbly intreating him of the infinite mercy and goodness and for the merit of his Sonne not to impute unto mee the multitude of my sinnes but soe to satisfie his {ustire} for them in the

sufferings of the Lord Jesus that none of them may at any tyme hereafter be layd to my charge but that my debt being fully discharged in his death I may have life eternall by his absolute and alsufficient satisfying of the law of God for mee and in my stead so such I doe most humbly beg for his truth and promise safe and for the Lord Jesus Christ his sune and in this believe faith and confidence I now her[e] and doe undoubtedly resolve trusting in Gods grace to end my life weelding all honour glorie and praise unto my God for the same And as concerning my bodie as it was made of earth for it must returne tenther againe I desire mine Executors to cause the same to be in decent and seemely sort buried in the churchyard where I shall end the life assuring me such that at the resurrection of the inst it shall rise again through the Merrit of the Lord Jesus glorious mortall and powerfull and hereby I doe utterly revoke all former wills and testaments heretofore by mee made and doe ordayne and make this to bee my last Will and testament And as for such goods and chattels lands and tenem[en]ts as it hath pleased God of his mercy to lend mee I doe hereby dispose give and grant them as followeth first and principally I give and bequeath my lands and tenements situate lyeing and being in Battisford in the Countie aforesaid unto mine Executors hereafter named and to their heires for ever to sell the land within the years after my decease to pay my debts and performe such legacies as hereafter shall be sett downe and expressed at such tyme and tymes to such person and persons as hereafter followeth. Item I give & bequeath unto **Robert Huntington my eldest sonne** the sume of two hundred pounds of lawfull money of England to be paid unto him by mine Executors out of the lands which shall be sould

by mine Executors withyn two years next after my decease. Item I give and bequeath unto **Richard Huntington my second sonne** the sume of one hundred pounts of lawfull money of England to be paid unto hym by myne Executors out of my lands before given at his age of one and twentie yeares. Item I give and bequeath unto Henry Huntington my sonne one hundred pounds of lawfull money of England to be paid unto him my myne Executors out of my lands at his age of one and twentie yeares. Items I give and bequeath unto **Marie Huntington my daughter** the some of three score pounds of lawfull money of England to be paid unto her by myne Executors withyn one month after mine Executors have made sale of my lands. Item I give and bequeath unto **Martha Huntington my daughter** the some of three score pounds of lawfull money of England to be paid unto her by mine Executors at her age of one and twentie yeares. Item I give & bequeath until **Margarett my daughter** the some of three score pounds of lawfull money of England to be paid unto her by myne Executors at her age of one and twentie yeares. Item I will and my mynd is that myne Executors shall bee at the charge of manntening and bringing up of my said children until his or her or their portons shall grow due. Provyded alwaies my mynd is that if it shall pease God to take any of my said children out of this world before their said {poe?all ???} shall grow due that then his her or their porsione soe deseasing shall bee equallie devyded amongst the survivors of them which shall bee then having part & part like. Also my will and mind is that if my lande and moveable goods and chattels will not extend to the paying of my debts and performing of my legacies then to deduct defalte and abate soe much of my childrens porcons [portions] porporcionally as shall make it good, part and part like according to their porcons And if there shall be any remainder left or overplus when legacies are performed and my debts paid I give it unto **Robert Huntington my eldest sonne**. Item I make ordayne nominate and appoint for my Executors John Locke of Hinderclaie, **Rob[er]t Huntington of Battsford**, **John Mannyng** of Combes and **James Gardiner of Kettlebaston** in the countie of Suffolk yeoman offering them as my trusty friends to pay my debts performe my lecacies and to see my bodie in decent manner brought to the Grave and to take have all my moveable goods towards the performing of this my will the goods which my wife brought with excepted. In wittnes whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and seale the daie and yeare abovewritten. **Robert Huntington** published sealed and delivered in the presence of us **Steph[en] Kymbould**, **William Jacob**, **Clement Hoggs** and **Bartholomew Salter**.

First I bequeath my Soule to Almightye God my Creator and maker and to Jesus Christ my mercifull Redeemer, and to the holy Ghost my endless comforter, {?stinge} by and through the blood shedding of my Saviour Jesus Christ, and have repentance of my sins in heavin after this life ended to have a resting place And my Bodye to be Buryed in such ordinary place where it shall please God to call me to his mercye And as for the disposition of my worldlie lands and goodes I give and bequeath as hereafter ensueth. Item I give and bequeath to **Susan my daughter** one peece of ground lyinge in Combes in the Countye of Suff[olk] which I purchased of **Steven Reeble** containing fower acres to her and

Alsoe I give and bequeath to **Susan my said daughter** the sume of sixtie pounds to be paid by mine Executor hereafter menconed within five months after my decease And if default of payment happen to be made in part or in all that then my will and minde is that **Susan my said daughter** shall enter into and upon a {??} close called **Wood Close** abutting upon **Battsford Tye towards the North** and upon the lately **George Kinge** towards the West to have and to hold the said **Wood Close** to her and her hieres until she shal be fully satisfied and paid with her personalle

Item I give and bequeath to **Robert Huntington my sonne** all the meonie profitts of those lands as they are moine inclosed lyeinge in **Combes** aforesaid called and knowne by the name of **Motts** until Michaelmas after my decease and one whole yeare after not {???} stripp nor {???} thereupon. Item I give and bequeath to **Mary my daughter and Susan my said daughter** all those lands by the name of **Motts** to them and their heires for ever to be equally divided between them. Item I give and bequeath to **Robt Huntington my sonne** All my **houses and lands meadows and pastures** with the appurtenances lyeinge and being **in the parish of Batisford** aforesaid. Item I give and bequeath to **Susan my said daughter** my best bedstead and bed equip[ment] and all that belongeth to it according as the house shall afford. Alsoe I give to **Susan my said daughter** one of the trundle bedsteads to be of her owne choice with the worst featherbed and and a little feather bolster with a bluwe blanket and a white blanket. Also I give to **Susan my said daughter** my second brass pott and my second pestle and a little skillet. Item I give and bequeath to **my said three children that is to say Robert, Mary and Susan** each of them one silver spoone. Item I give and bequeath to my **daughter Mary** her twoe {s???} each of them one {pewter?} platter of the middle {four?} of {pewter?}. Item I give to **Robert my sonne and Susan my daughter** all the rest of my pewter and {dis???} and spoons to be equally devided btween them. Alsoe I give and bequeath to **Robert my said sonne & Susan my said daughter** all my lynnens to be equally devided betwixt them. Item I give and bequeath unto **Major Blackmore** my dunn nag to be delivered to him immediatly after my decease, and after my funeral expenses discharged and my legacies herein this my will duely payd as aforesaid I doe him make and ordaine **Robert Huntington my Brother** my full and sole Executor of this my last will and testament and alsoe I do ordaine him the sayd Robert my full and whole executor of all my land or lands goods and chattles whatsoever not before in these presents yet given and bequeathed And I utterly revoke and adnull all and every other former wills and testaments and legacies bequests in any wise by me before this tyme named willed and bequeathed. In witness whereof the sayd **Henry Huntington** have hereunto sett my hand and Seale the day and yeare first above written Henry Huntington Sealed and declared to be the last will and testament of the above sayd **Henry Huntington** in the presence of Ambrose Clarke of Hunton [*Honington?*], John Hawke, Edmond Bere.

This will was proved at Westminster before the Judges for Probate of Wills and granting of Administrations lawfully authorised the third day of March one thousand six hundred fifty three by the ^{^^} of Robert Huntington his Brother the only Executor named in the sayd will to whom Administration was remitted he being first Servant truely to Administer the Same.
